On the Great Care We Should Take in Preparing to Receive Christ in Holy Communion

The Beloved: I am a lover of purity and the giver of all holiness. It is a pure heart that I look for; that is the place in which I rest. Make ready for me a large upper room, furnished; there will I and my disciples eat the Paschal meal with you... Everyone who loves another makes ready for that beloved friend of his the best and most beautiful room he has; in so doing he shews his loving joy at welcoming his friend to his home. 2.You must realize, though, that even were you to prepare for a whole year, with nothing else to give your mind to, you could make no adequate preparation for me, if I assessed your efforts by their merits. It is only through my kindness and grace that you are allowed access to my table; as if a beggar were invited to a rich man's dinner and were able to repay the kindness shewn him only by humbly expressing his thanks. Do the best you can, and do it with care, not from habit or necessity, but with loving dread and reverence receive the body of your beloved Lord and God, who lays aside his greatness to come to you. It is I who have invited you, I who have bidden this Sacrament to be; I will make up whatever in you is lacking; come and receive me. 3. When I accord you the grace of devout feelings, give thanks to your God for it, not that you deserve it, but because I have had pity upon you. If, on the other hand, you have no such feelings, but are conscious of dryness of heart, keep on with your prayers, knock at my door and sigh; never give up until you merit some crumb, some drop of my saving grace. You have need of me; I have no need of you. It is not that you come and make me holy; it is I that come to make you holier and better than before. You come to be made holy by me, to be made one with me; you come to receive fresh grace, to be fired anew with the desire to amend your life. Do not neglect this grace; make ready your heart with all the care you can, and then bring into it him whom you love. 4.You should not only make a devout preparation for Holy Communion, but keep yourself in that devout frame of mind when once you have received the Sacrament. Your watchful care after Communion is no less important than your devout preparation before it. When we keep good watch over ourselves after Communion, it is the best preparation we can make for receiving greater grace. For this we become ill-fitted indeed if we immediately rush off to the pleasures of the visible world. Beware of much talking; stay by yourself in some place apart and there rejoice in the company of your God; there you have him within you, and the whole world cannot take him from you. I am he to whom you should surrender your whole being, so that henceforth, untouched by care, you may live no longer in yourself but in me.



10 COMPELLING REASONS TO PRAY

1.Beause only prayer can save the world. Nothing but saints can save our world because the deepest root of all the world's diseases is sin, and saints are the antibodies that fight sin.

2.Because God commands it. God commands us to pray, in fact to "constantly" (1 Thess 5:17)... We pray to obey God, not to "play God." We pray, not to change God's mind, but to change our own; not to command God, but to let God command us.
 3.Because whatever God does, he does for good reasons. Three reasons God commands us to pray...: prayer gives truth to our mind, goodness to our will, and beauty to our heart.

4.Because God's honor deserves it. We should pray because prayer is the most realistic thing in the world to do. It is our acknowledgement of reality (that God is God, the Absolute Reality).

5.Because we do not have an infinite amount of time. We are one day nearer Home today than we ever were before. I guarantee you that after you die you will not say "I spent too much time praying; I wish I had watched more TV instead."

6.*Prayer is delightful*. There is not in the world a kind of life more sweet and delightful than that of a continual conversation with God. Those only can comprehend it who practice and experience it." (The Practice of the Presence of God)

7.Prayer is the way to know God. To know anyone, you must not just know thousands of things about him, but you must know him, you must meet him, you must spend time with him, or, as Brother Lawrence would say, "practice his presence."

8. Prayer is the essential prerequisite for all religious teachers, catechists, evangelists, and preachers. For the thing that all we fallen sons of Adam and daughters of Eve most deeply need (and also, deep down, know that we need, even if we deny this knowledge with our words) is not a knowledge about God but a knowledge of God.

9.Prayer is the only way to spiritual progress. We must pray in order to grow, and we must grow because Infinite Love will not, cannot, settle for less than the greatest joy of which his beloved creature is capable.

10.Because without it we cannot attain the meaning of life, the end and purpose of our existence. Becoming saints is the meaning of life. It is why we exist. It is why God created us... Prayer is our first step in becoming saints.

Why Do Catholics Pray the Rosary?

To best respond to this question, one must be aware that the Bible and the Rosary are not opposed to each other, they're not mutually exclusive. Without the Word of God there would be no Rosary, and praying the Rosary only magnifies the Word of God in the soul In fact, the prayers of the Rosary find their very source and meaning in the Bible. The 20 mysteries of the Rosary are meditations on events or teachings found in the Bible. All three essential prayers prayed on the beads of the rosary use words that are written or find their roots in sacred Scripture. The "Our Father" prayed at the beginning of each mystery are the words of the prayer Christ Himself taught His disciples (Matt. 6:9-13). The "Hail Mary" is the most common prayer in the Rosary and begins with the words of greeting to the Virgin Mary from the Archangel Gabriel and her cousin St. Elizabeth (Luke 1:28, 42). The Third prayer known as the "Glory Be" has its roots in the book of Revelation 4:8. The Holy Rosary makes absolutely NO obstacle to the Word of God. In fact, the Rosary makes the Word of God more apparent and allows us to fathom it depths and allows the soul to commune with The Word Himself. The Rosary doesn't prevent the Word of God any more than plates or silverware prevent one from eating a meal. The Rosary places NO obstacle to the Word of God any more than a telescope obstructs an astronomer's view of the heavens. The Rosary simply and powerfully achieves this by the intercession of Our Mother Mary who knows Christ better than those who wrote the Bible. By pondering the Word of God with His Mother, we begin to know Christ. We need the intercession of the Blessed Mother as much now as we did 100 years ago when she appeared to the young children at Fatima. She will show us her Son, the Word of God. Pray the Rosary every day.

The 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 22-23: Worship Aid

Welcome to St. Clare of Assisi Parish! We are glad you are here for the celebration of the Holy Mass. Please take note of the guidelines for the reception of Holy Communion: Prior to receiving Communion, Catholics should have fasted for one hour; water and medicine excepting. Catholics aware of grave sin (e.g. intentionally missing Mass on Sunday/Holy Days, abortion, theft, sexual sin, use of contraceptives, etc.) should go to Confession prior to receiving Communion. Because of our belief in the Eucharist being the Body and Blood of Christ, reception of Communion is reserved to Catholics. There may exist circumstances in the lives of some individual Catholics, which may not facilitate immediate participation in receiving Communion (e.g., cohabitation, marriage outside the Church). A priest would be happy to assist you in rectifying these situations. We come together to worship God in spirit and in truth.

Entrance Hymn: I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say 707

1.I heard the voice of Jesus say, "Come unto me and rest; Lay down, O weary one, lay down Your head upon my breast." I came to Jesus as I was, so weary, worn, and sad: I found in Him a resting place, and He has made me glad.
2.I heard the voice of Jesus say, "Behold, I freely give the living water; thirsty one, stoop down and drink and live." I came to Jesus, and I drank of that life-giving stream; my thirst was quenched, my soul revived, and now I live in him.
