On the Great Goodness and Love Shewn by God to Man in this Sacrament

Trusting in your goodness, Lord, in your great mercy, I come in my sickness to him who can make me well; hungered and athirst, I come to the fountain of life, a beggar to the King of Heaven, a servant to his Lord, a creature to his Creator, one lonely and sad to him who loves and consoles me. But what have I done to deserve that you should come to me? Who am I, that you should make me a gift of yourself? Dare I, a sinner, appear before you? And do you forget your greatness and come to a sinner? You know this servant of yours; you know nothing good of him, to make him deserve this gift at your hands. I do not hide my wretchedness; I acknowledge your goodness, I praise your kindness, I thank you for your overwhelming love. It is for your own sake that you do this, not for any merit of mine. It is to make your goodness better known to me, to bestow you love more fully upon me, to give me a more wondrous example of humility. Since, then, it pleases you so to deal with me, since you have commanded that things should be so, it pleases me in my turn that you should stoop to my lowliness; and I hope that my sinfulness may not stand as a barrier between us. 2. O Jesus, sweetest, kindest, what great worship and thanksgiving we ought to shew you, what neverending praise, in return for the gift of your holy body! There is not a man to be found able to unfold in words its wonderful power. But what shall my thoughts be of as I make this Communion of mine, as I draw near to my Lord? To worship him as I ought is beyond my power, and yet I long to receive him devoutly. What better thought can I have, what thought more profitable for my soul's health, than this: to abase myself entirely before you and to praise your boundless goodness towards me? I praise you, 0 my God, I give you glory forever. Myself I look on with scorn and place at your feet, in the depths of my nothingness...4. See where love has its source, see how brightly shines this divine abasement! How deep should our thanks be, how sincere our praise, for this your gift. It was indeed a device to heal and profit our souls, when you brought this Sacrament into being; a sweet and joyous banquet indeed, in which you gave yourself to be our food. What wonderful things you do, Lord! How mighty your power is, how unfailing your truth! You gave the word, and everything came into being; so was it with this Sacrament, because it was you who so gave command. 5. How wonderful a thing it is, worthy of man's belief, yet exceeding the grasp of his mind, that you, my Lord and my God, truly God and truly man, are wholly contained beneath the lowly shape of bread and wine; that you are eaten by him who receives you, and yet not consumed. You, the Lord of all things, who stand in need of nothing, have wished to live in our midst by means of this Sacrament. Keep my heart and my body free from stain, so that with a glad and untroubled conscience I may take part more frequently in this mystery of yours; and may I receive to my eternal salvation this Sacrament that you have blessed and devised to be for your own particular honour your everlasting keepsake. 6. Be glad, my soul; thank God for leaving behind for you in this vale of tears so precious a gift as this is, so matchless a comfort. For every time you consider this mystery and receive the body of Christ you are furthering the work of your redemption and partaking in all the merits of Christ.

Chaplet of St. Michael the Archangel

Begin with the Sign of the Cross and the words.

V. O God come to my assistance. R. O Lord make haste to help me. Glory be to the Father...

Then pray the 9 Invocations. After each Invocation pray 1 Our Father and 3 Hail Marys.

1st Invocation

Through the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly choir of Seraphim, may the Lord enflame us with the virtue of Charity.

2nd Invocation

Through the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly choir of Cherubim, may God grant us the grace to put aside the ways of the world and walk the path of Christian perfection. 3rd Invocation

Through the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly choir of Thrones, may the Lord grant us a true and sincere spirit of humility. 4th Invocation

Through the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly choir of Dominions, may God grant us the

grace to guard our senses and restrain our wayward passions. 5th Invocation Through the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly choir of Powers, may the Lord protect us,

body and soul, against the snares and temptations of the devil. 6th Invocation

Through the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly choir of Virtues, may God preserve us from evil and be our safeguard against temptation.

7th Invocation

Through the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly choir of Principalities, may the Lord fill us with a true spirit of obedience to all of his commandments.

8th Invocation

Through the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly choir of Archangels, may God grant us perseverance in faith and good works so that one day we may join the angels and saints in heaven.

9th Invocation

Through the intercession of St. Michael and the heavenly choir of angels, may the Lord grant us their protection in this life and their companionship in the life to come

WHAT IS NFP?

Natural Family Planning (NFP) is a holistic way for a husband and wife to monitor and observe a woman's fertility. The natural signs of a woman's fertility are recorded and used to either achieve or avoid a pregnancy. NFP involves practicing periodic abstinence for the husband and wife, and does not utilize any form of barrier or withdrawal of the marital act.



Discovering God Together: THE GUDE TO RASING FAITHFUL KIDS

Have you wondered what your responsibility is as a Catholic parent, on how to share and instill a deep love for our Faith that lasts through adulthood? Are you wondering what lies beyond "I take them to Mass and I take them to Religious Ed classes?" Join us each month as we work through Discovering God Together. The Catholic Guide to Raising Faithful Kids by Dr. Gregory K. and Lisa Popcak for help on your journey of raising faithful kids. During July, we will learn the 5 traits to disintquish: What Makes Catholic Families Different?

"How are Catholic families supposed to be different from other families? We don't mean different in the sense of putting on airs, pretending to be holier than thou, or acting in some weird way. But if you read the Church's writings on marriage and family life, you'll see that the Church is on a mission to promote a particular vision of family life that is different from that of other families, in the sense that it is more intimate, more joyful, more "together." In The Gospel of Life, St. John Paul the Great put forth what might be considered the mission statement for Catholic parents in contemporary times. 'By word and example, in the daily round of relations and choices, and through concrete actions and signs, parents lead their children to authentic freedom, actualized in the sincere gift of self, and they cultivate in them respect for others, a sense of justice, cordial openness, dialogue, generous service, solidarity and all the other values which help people to live life as a gift. (no. 92)' This is the unique, Catholic vision of family life Catholic parents are called to uphold. Clearly it is a different vision of family life from the one that the world has to offer. Sadly, too many Catholic kids are being raised in homes that don't look any different from the homes of their secular or Protestant friends except for the prayers they say and maybe the rules they have. As a result, Catholic parents are undermining their own best efforts to raise faithful children and to bear witness to the joy of the gospel. As Christians, we are called to be salt and light in the world - God wants to change the world through the example of love lived out in our families. So how do we do it?...We suggest that the following five traits distinguish a family seeking to live the authentic Catholic difference in their daily lives. 1. Catholic families worship together. The Eucharist is the source of our love and the sign of the intimacy to which we are called. Therefore, as a family, we attend Mass together on Sundays and holy days and we actively participate in our parish. 2. Catholic families pray together. The Church refers to the family as the "domestic church" because family life is where the faith is supposed to be lived out every day...As Catholic families, we recognize that we cannot love one another as God loves us unless we ask him - together - to teach us what this means."

The 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 6-7: Worship Aid

Welcome to St. Clare of Assisi Parish! We are glad you are here for the celebration of the Holy Mass. Please take note of the guidelines for the reception of Holy Communion: Prior to receiving Communion, Catholics should have fasted for one hour; water and medicine excepting. Catholics aware of grave sin (e.g. intentionally missing Mass on Sunday/Holy Days, abortion, theft, sexual sin, use of contraceptives, etc.) should go to Confession prior to receiving Communion. Because of our belief in the Eucharist being the Body and Blood of Christ, reception of Communion is reserved to Catholics. There may exist circumstances in the lives of some individual Catholics, which may not facilitate immediate participation in receiving Communion (e.g., cohabitation, marriage outside the Church). A priest would be happy to assist you in rectifying these situations. We come together to worship God in spirit and in truth.


