

And he declared that this act of unity must be repeated down through the ages as the defining gesture of the Israelite nation. The Passover meal, in a word, was a recovery (however imperfect) of the easy unity and fellowship of the Garden of Eden, God hosting a banquet at which his human creatures share life with him and each other. Though this theme is a bit muted in the Exodus story, the united Israel was intended by God to be a catalyst for the unification of the world. We must recall that the rescue operation is directed to the descendants of Adam and Eve—which is to say, to the whole human race. God chose Israel neither because of their special merits nor for their peculiar advantage, but rather as a vehicle to carry his salvation to the nations. These slave families, gathering in hope and fellowship around a meal of roasted lamb, bitter herbs, and unleavened bread, were, in the biblical reading, the seeds from which the family of God will grow. The second Old Testament instance of meal symbolism that I would like to examine is found in the book of the prophet Isaiah...In the second chapter of Isaiah, we find this splendid vision: "In days to come the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hills: all the nations shall stream to it..." The mountain of the Lord's house is Zion, where the temple, the place of right worship, is situated. What Isaiah dreams of here, is the coming together of all the scattered tribes of Israel around the worship of the true God. The division that commenced with the idolatry in the Garden of Eden is healed through a grateful acknowledgment of God's primacy. The distinctive mark of this rightly ordered worship is peace...Having found friendship with God, Isaiah implies, human beings will rediscover friendship with one another, and they will not feel the need to train for war anymore. The cosmic implication of this reconciliation is made plain in the eleventh chapter of Isaiah, where the prophet dreams of the age of the Messiah. "The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid...They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain." We saw that the original sin entailed a falling apart of the whole of God's creation, a setting at enmity of humanity and nature. Here, on the holy mountain, the place of right worship, all is reconciled and reintegrated. But there is a 3rd and culminating feature of God's holy mountain that Isaiah specially emphasizes. The mountain is also the locale of a magnificent meal. In Isaiah's vision, the gathered community is fed by a gracious God with the finest foods, calling to mind the situation in the Garden of Eden before the eating and drinking was interrupted by a grasp at godliness. The prophet envisions all the nations of the world, living in nonviolence and informed by right worship, able to share life with God and one another, receiving

You should:

- **1.**Be married for 25 years, 50 years, or 5 year increments after 50 years (e.g. 55, 60)
- **2.**Give the office a minimum of 2 weeks notice and allow time for the office to confirm the date and Mass time with the Priest
- **3.**Have your family arrive early enough to reserve enough space toward the front
- **4.**Be prepared to receive your Blessing following the Prayer After Communion and before the Final Blessing and Dismissal.

Discovering God Together: THE GUDE TO PAISING FAITHFUL KIDS

Have you wondered what your responsibility is as a Catholic parent, on how to share and instill a deep love for our Faith that lasts through adulthood? Are you wondering what lies beyond "I take them to Mass and I take them to Religious Ed classes?" Join us each week as we work through Discovering God Together. The Catholic Guide to Raising Faithful Kids by Dr. Gregory K. and Lisa Popcak for help on your journey of raising faithful kids. In August, we will learn about: Life in the Dornestic Church: Rituals & Routines

The family with strong *talk rituals*, such as meaningful mealtimes, family walks, one-on-one dates with kids, and so forth, Pope Francis refers to as "wasting time with our children." We live in an age when "normal" family life consists almost entirely of conversations about who needs to be taken where and what needs to be picked up from the grocery store. Real conversations about our children's thoughts, feelings, hopes, dreams, fears, faults, failures, and deeper needs don't happen if we aren't intentional about making time for such discussions. We are used to talking at our children, but discipleship relationships are mainly about listening. We tend not to think of it this way, but Catholic parents are in essence their children's spiritual directors. To be effective spiritual directors to our children, we simply need to create time simply to listen and learn what is important to them. BUT... children are terrible with "let's sit down and talk" time. They need conversations to emerge naturally from our interactions with them. When we carve out time to "do nothing" together, we create moments when it feels safe to begin discussing more personal topics. After a respectful period of time has passed to communicate that our kids have our full attention, we can ask direct questions about their lives and concerns; they are then more likely to respond because they know they will be heard. When we take the time to listen to our kids, they are more likely to listen to us, internalize our advice, and see the value of our counsel, because they will feel as if we really understand them and that our advice was meant for them and not something we said randomly to make us feel like parents.

Reflection questions to ask ourselves as a family.

1.Are you kids comfortable talking to us about things that are important to you or weighing on you? 2.What are some ways we can "do nothing" together so we can all get comfortable talking?

The 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 17-18: Worship Aid

Welcome to St. Clare of Assisi Parish! We are glad you are here for the celebration of the Holy Mass. Please take note of the guidelines for the reception of Holy Communion: Prior to receiving Communion, Catholics should have fasted for one hour; water and medicine excepting. Catholics aware of grave sin (e.g. intentionally missing Mass on Sunday/Holy Days, abortion, theft, sexual sin, use of contraceptives, etc.) should go to Confession prior to receiving Communion. Because of our belief in the Eucharist being the Body and Blood of Christ, reception of Communion is reserved to Catholics. There may exist circumstances in the lives of some individual Catholics, which may not facilitate immediate participation in receiving Communion (e.g., cohabitation, marriage outside the Church).
