
St. Clare of Assisi is an official Baby Safe Haven location. Parents or agents of parents can drop off an unharmed newborn baby to a staff member during regular office hours.

Registration is the official way to join our community! Many people think because they attend the parish, they are automatically members. Without formal enrollment, we can't accurately gauge our membership or take a census. Census numbers determine how many priests are assigned to a parish, how many Masses or Confession opportunities we provide, and the number or frequency of faith formation opportunities. Registration shows us you belong! It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, getting God parent and sponsor certificates, getting approved for reduced tuition through Catholic schools, and getting copies of your donations for tax reporting. Registering in our parish is a statement of faith, of confidence in our mission, and your response to the call for the New Evangelization! To say "body" and "blood," in the nondualist context of first-century Judaism, is to say "self," and thus Jesus was inviting his disciples to feed on him and thereby to draw his life into theirs, conforming themselves to him in the most intimate and complete way possible. We must never keep the account of the fall far from our minds when we consider these events. If our trouble began with a bad meal (seizing at godliness on our own terms), then our salvation commences with a rightly structured meal (God offering us his life as a free gift). What was foreshadowed when Mary laid the Christ child in the manger came, at this meal, to full expression. It is of great moment that, immediately after this extraordinary eventthis constitution of the Church around God's gift of self—Jesus speaks of treachery. In the biblical reading, God's desires have been, from the beginning, opposed. Consistently, human beings have preferred the isolation and separation of sin to the festivity of the sacred meal. Theologians have called this anomalous tendency the *mysterium iniquitatis* (the mystery of evil), for there is no rational ground for it, no reason why it should exist. But there it stubbornly is, always shadowing the good, parasitic upon that which is tries to destroy. Therefore, we should not be too surprised that, as the sacred meal comes to its richest possible expression, evil accompanies it. Judas the betrayer expresses the *mysterium* iniquitatis with particular symbolic power, for he had pent years in intimacy with Jesus, taking in the Lord's moves and thoughts at close quarters, sharing the table of fellowship with him, and yet he saw fit to turn Jesus over to his enemies and to interrupt the coinherence of the Last Supper. Those of us who regularly gather around the table of intimacy with Christ and yet engage consistently in the works of darkness are meant to see ourselves in the betrayer. What follows is a scene that, were it not so tragic, would be funny. Having experienced firsthand the intense act of love by which Jesus formed a new humanity around the eating of his Body and the drinking of his Blood, having sensed that the deepest meaning of this new life is self-sacrificing love, the disciples guarrel about titles and honors. In the table fellowship that he practiced throughout his ministry, Jesus, as we saw, consistently undermined the systems of domination and the social stratifications that marked the culture of his time. His order (God's kingdom) would be characterized by an equality and mutuality born of our shared relationship to the creator God. Therefore, games of ambition and claims of social superiority are inimical to the community that finds its point of orientation around the table of Jesus' Body and Blood. And this is why Jesus responded so promptly and unambiguously to the disciples' childish preoccupations: "The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those in authority over them are called benefactors. But not so with you; rather the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like one who serves" (Luke 22:25-26).








## TWENTY FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### **DECLINE TO** SIGN: PROP 139




Come this November, vote NO on Proposition 139 relating to the "Fundamental Right to Abortion."

This ballot measure would permanently enshrine abortion up to birth under a broad physical and mental health exemption in the Arizona constitution, it would completely eradicate parental rights so that an abortion could be performed on a child of any age without parental knowledge or consent. the proposal erases any current laws in place, such as the Itrasound requirement, 24-hour waiting period, abortion risk education, or alternatives to abortion such as adoption. # Discovering God Together: THE GUDE TO PLANTING FAITHFUL KIDS

Have you wondered what your responsibility is as a Catholic parent, on how to share and instill a deep love for our Faith that lasts through adulthood? Are you wondering what lies beyond "I take them to Mass and I take them to Religious Ed classes?" Join us each week as we work through Discovering God Together. The Catholic Guide to Raising Faithful Kids by Dr. Gregory K. and Lisa Popcak for help on your journey of raising faithful kids. Let's read on to learn how to Go and Make Disciples of Your Children: Creating Discipleship Hearts.

We have discussed how family rituals serve as the skeleton of the discipleship relationship you need to have with your children in order to help them see the relevance of God and your faith in their everyday lives. But while making time for family rituals is critical for creating a discipleship relationship with your children, you will also need to open your children's hearts to these activities so that they will be willing participants and will actively seek all the blessings they can receive from these times together with you. We regularly hear from families who try to enact rituals like game nights or prayer times only to have it end in bickering, bitterness, and tears. Part of this is making a commitment to these rituals and sticking it out through any initial resistance but the other part is to make sure that your children have a healthy attachment to the life of your family; that you have taught your children how to have the heart of a disciple. A child with a discipleship heart is one who displays the characteristics of openness, affection, cheerful obedience, and playfulness.

**Openness**: the child willingly receives and often requests your advice on personal or emotional topics and takes what you say to heart. Openness is an essential ingredient for discipleship because it enables your child to be receptive to your example and instruction.

**Affection**: the child initiates affection with you and willingly and comfortably receives the affection you offer him. Affection is an essential ingredient of discipleship because it speaks to the strength of your connection with your child. A child who willingly receives and seeks your affection is a child whose heart is open to a deeper relationship with you and the God you serve.

#### The 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 21-22: Worship Aid

Welcome to St. Clare of Assisi Parish! We are glad you are here for the celebration of the Holy Mass. Please take note of the guidelines for the reception of Holy Communion: Prior to receiving Communion, Catholics should have fasted for one hour; water and medicine excepting. Catholics aware of grave sin (e.g. intentionally missing Mass on Sunday/Holy Days, abortion, theft, sexual sin, use of contraceptives, etc.) should go to Confession prior to receiving Communion. Because of our belief in the Eucharist being the Body and Blood of Christ, reception of Communion is reserved to Catholics. There may exist circumstances in the lives of some individual Catholics, which may not facilitate immediate participation in receiving Communion (e.g., cohabitation, marriage outside the Church). A priest would be happy to assist you in rectifying these situations. We come together to worship God in spirit and in truth.
